Yunnan boxing to debut at the Olympics

In late June, the global boxing consolation game for the Rio Olympic Games 2016 was held in Baku, Azerbaijan. Yunnan boxer Shan Jun took part in the 60-kilogram competition, representing the Chinese national boxing team. After winning four successive matches to reach the semi-finals, Shan secured himself a place at the Rio Olympics. This is the first time that a Yunnan boxer will compete at the Olympics. Shan said, "I will cherish this hard-earned chance and try my best at the Olympics!"

Shan Jun began his athletic career on the Yunnan Provincial boxing team in 2010. As an "especially hardworking" athlete, Shan stood out among his peers and in quick succession earned spots on the national youth team and national team. Shan Jun won the 2012 Chinese Youth Boxing Championship, the 2014 National Championship and the 2015 National Tournament. At the 2015 International I will cherish this hard-earned chance and try my best at the Olympics!"

Boxing Club League matches, Shan Jun was one of the most outstanding players on the Chinese team. However, failing to win the season championship deprived him of directly qualifying for the Rio Olympics.

In March 2016, Shan made his comeback at the Asia Pacific regional qualifications, but failed in the semi-finals again.

Never discouraged by his defeats, Shan picked himself up and decided to try his luck at the consolation games in Azerbaijan – reputedly against some of the most difficult competition. Out of a total of 45 participants, Shan won four matches in a row to reach the semi-finals as of June 24th, and thus successfully threading his way to the Rio Olympics.

Kunming-Sydney direct flights to open

Direct flights from Kunming to Sydney will be opened by the end of this year, becoming the fourth direct intercontinental flight route of the Kunming International Airport following the opening of direct flights to Paris, Vancouver (via Shanghai) and San Francisco (via Qingdao, planned). Data show that Kunming Airport had opened 284 routes as of 2015. Currently, there are 132 flights between Kunming and Southeast Asian and South Asian cities every week. The passenger throughput of the airport is expected to reach 70 million in 2020.

South Asian and Southeast Asian regional logistics network to establish

"As of 2020, the growth value of Yunnan's logistics industry will reach 200 billion yuan, with an average annual growth rate of about 13 percent. The total social logistics costs will drop to account for less than 18 percent of the GDP." According to Yunnan Provincial Department of Commerce, Yunnan is set to establish an international logistics network to link Yunnan, the rest of China, South Asia and Southeast Asia.

By 2017, the growth value of logistics industry in Yunnan will reach 140 billion yuan. Over the following five years, Yunnan is going to build 20 logistics demonstration parks and 100 key logistics enterprises. At present, apart from fostering a number of key logistics enterprises, Yunnan has signed cooperation agreements with logistic giants such as Suning Group, SF Express and Guiyang Truck Logistics. Cooperation intentions have also been reached with Asia's largest logistics and real estate company ProLogis (China) Investment & Management Company.

"Spring City" increasingly popular

Last month, Kunming was listed among top three summer resorts worldwide for the second time since 2015. The city later took the second place among the most livable cities in China according to a report released by the Chinese Academy of Sciences. During the China Summer Tourism Industry Summit 2016 opened in Changchun, Kunming was again selected as the Best City for Summer Tourism. Over the past few months, Kunming has become a catchword for its cool summer climate and inviting natural conditions.
