The 2016 Yunnan-Thailand educational exchange conference took place on July 11 at Yunnan Minzu University (old campus) in Kunming, capital city of southwest China's Yunnan Province.

THAI BOXING

For Chinese film crew, the most attracting things are the diversity of shooting spots, unique culture, efficient filming approval procedures and high quality local assistant team.

The director of Thai Film Office said at the interview said that there were more and more Chinese film shooting team coming to Thailand, and in 2015, Chinese film contributed THB 0.455 billion for Thailand (THB 1 equals to about RMB 0.19), among which 13 films accounted for nearly 80% of earnings. The director also mentioned that Tourism Authority of Thailand invited Chinese film teams to shoot in Thailand for Thai

tourism promotion purposes as well.

It is said that China Hongkong firstly began to shoot film and television in Thailand. Since the Lost, Thailand is gradually popular in mainland of China.

When Detective Chinatown was shooting last year in Bangkok, a whole busy street was closed with the assistance of tourism department. It is because Thai Film Office is affiliated with Ministry of Tourism and Sports, therefore foreign film crews are able to apply for shooting in public places, national parks, airports and military base. In recent years, Chinese film

industry has developed rapidly and there are potential market

ahead. Thai films and TV series are popular in China, especially Thai food and culture enjoyed a good reputation in Chinese audiences. The director of Culture Promotion Department of Culture Department of Thailand mentioned that values and customs between two countries were similar, and movie was the most direct way for people from two countries to enhance communication and understanding. Thailand attached great importance to communication and cooperation between the two countries in terms of film industry and she believed that there will be huge prospects of cooperation in the future.

Yunnan to foster 100 agricultural giants By Yan Xiu'e

According to Agriculture Department of Yunnan Province, Yunnan has attained fruitful achievements in developing its modern plateau agriculture. The exports of vegetables and fruits have exceeded those of tobacco, topping Yunnan's agricultural export list.

In recent years, Yunnan's plateau agriculture has developed rapidly, with the production of rubber, coffee and flowers ranking first in China. Meanwhile, sugarcane and tea production rank second in terms of cultivation area and production capacity. In addition, silk production also ranks third in terms of total cultivation area, fifth in production capacity while potatos ranks fifth nationally in terms of both.

Over the next five years, Yunnan will continue to push forward the development of 10 key industries including the raising of pigs, cattle and goats, as well as cultivation of vegetables, flowers and nursery stocks, Chinese herbal medicines, tea, walnut, fruits, coffee and edible fungus. Combined, those products have a targeted output value of 770 billion yuan. The province is also aiming at fostering some 100 agriculture giants each with an annual output value of one billion yuan. The output value of pig farming industry is expected to reach 150 billion yuan, while that of vegetables, flowers and Chinese herbal medicines should reach 100 billion yuan each.

China showing goodwill in water diplomacy: Vietnamese reports

As a big power in the upstream of the Mekong which has crucial role in socio-economic situation of countries in the Southeast Asia, China is showing its goodwill to join hands in dealing with water resource with neighboring countries in the downstream area, said a Vietnamese state newspaper on Tuesday.

This is a positive move in Beijing's"water diplomacy,"Nhan Dan (People) Newspaer assessed in its report about Mekong River cooperation, adding that countries in the Mekong basin hold responsibility for suitable use of Mekong water.

Mekong River originates in China and runs through Myanmar, Laos, Thailand, Cambodia and Vietnam. It is known as Lancang in the Chinese stretch.

In the context that lives of millions of people in the river basin have been largely affected by climate change, a closer and more active cooperation mechanism among related countries is needed to exploit and effectively use the important water resource in Mekong River, reported Nhan Dan.

From March 15 to May 31, China discharged water from southwest Yunnan province's Jinghong Hydropower Station to the lower reaches of the Mekong River.

The move aimed to alleviate severe drought partially caused by El Nino phenomenon in Mekong downstream.

During the first Lancang-Mekong Cooperation (LMC) leaders' meeting held in China's Hainan Province in late March, six Mekong countries continue to affirm their cooperation for peaceful, stable and sustainable development of the Mekong sub-region.

The LMC, involving China, Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar, Thailand and Vietnam, will focus on security and development, as well as political, social and cultural fields. Interconnectivity, production capacity, cross-border economy, water resources, agriculture and poverty alleviation are five priority directions for cooperation, claimed by Nhan Dan as background.
