### **International** arrivals at KCIA exceed 3 million

The annual number of inbound and outbound tourists passing through Kunming Changshui International Airport (KCIA) exceeded three million for the first time in 2017, according to recently released statistics from the Kunming customs office.

As of December 18, international arrivals at Kunming airport added up to 3.25 million, an increase of 22.83% year on year.

### Laos opens new consulate in China

A brand-new consulate-general of the Laos PDR officially opened in Changsha, capital of central China's Hunan Province on December 23, 2017.

The Lao consulate-general was jointly unveiled by the CPC Hunan Provincial Committee Secretary Du Jiahao and Lao Minister of Foreign Affairs Saleumxay Kommasith.

Kommasith said the exchanges and communication between Laos and Hunan is a manifestation of the continuous development of the traditional friendship and the comprehensive strategic partnership of cooperation between the two countries.

Du said Hunan and Laos are both landlocked. Sharing similarities in geological and natural conditions, the two sides maintained close trade and people-to-people exchanges.

# Xi's thought on socialist economy for new era takes shape

Xi Jinping Thought on Socialist Economy with Chinese Characteristics for a New Era has taken shape, according to a statement released after the Central Economic Work Conference concluded on Wednesday.

The thought is the "theoretical crystallization" of the past five years of practice in pushing forward China's economic development, and the "latest fruit" of socialist political economy with Chinese characteristics, the statement said.

The three-day conference was attended by

President Xi, who is also general secretary of the Communist Party of China (CPC) Central Committee and chairman of the Central Military Commission.

The annual meeting, which set the tone for China's economic policies in 2018, also described the thought as the "extremely precious spiritual wealth" of the CPC and the country. It must be adhered to for a long time and developed continuously.

According to the statement, the thought is mainly based on the new development philosophy, which was put forward by Xi in 2015 and features innovative, coordinated, green, open and shared development.

During the conference, the most important annual meeting on economic work in the country, Chinese leaders reviewed the country's economic performance over the past five years and mapped out plans for 2018.

This year's conference came after the CPC's twicea-decade national congress in October, during which Xi Jinping Thought on Socialism with Chinese Characteristics for a New Era was unveiled and listed as a part of the guiding ideology for the CPC in its amended Constitution.

"High-quality development" is a key phrase of the conference. China's economy has transitioned from a phase of rapid growth to a stage of high-quality development, said the statement.

"High-quality development is the fundamental requirement for determining the development path, making economic

policies, and conducting macroeconomic regulation at present and in the period to come," it said.

China will further supply-side structural reform and adopt a prudent and neutral monetary policy and a proactive fiscal policy, it said.

The leaders have also defined "preventing and defusing major risks, targeted poverty alleviation and pollution control" as the "three tough battles" for the next three years, according to the statement.

# Foundation of Lancang-Mekong vocational institute laid in Ruili, west Yunnan

The foundation-stone laying ceremony of the Lancang-Mekong International Vocational Institute, Yunnan Minzu University, was held in west Yunnan's border city of Ruili on the morning of December 17, 2017.

# China, Thailand inaugurate construction of high-speed railway in Thailand

Thailand and China jointly inaugurated the construction of Thailand's first high-speed railway from Bangkok to northeastern province of Nakhon Ratchasima on Thursday.

Chinese Premier Li Keqiang said in a congratulatory letter that the China-Thailand high-speed railway is a flagship project in jointly realizing the Belt and Road Initiative in the spirit of "wide consultation, joint construction and shared benefits."

The 253-km first phase of the railway links Bangkok with Nakhon Ratchasima province. China is responsible for design of the railway, supervision of construction and manufacturing of trains and

Once completed, the railway with a maximum speed of 250 km per hour will be the first highspeed railway of Thailand.

The planned second phase of the project will link Nakhon Ratchasima with Nong Khai on the border with Laos, which connects with the China-Laos railway in an artery railway linking Thailand, Laos and China.

Li said the project will contribute to infrastructure development and enhance connectivity in Thailand as well as in the region. He hoped both sides could cooperate to complete the first phase and push forward the

# China, Laos vow to keep railway project free from graft

Chinese and Lao companies participating in a transnational railway project signed a pledge vowing against corruption December 20 at the friendship tunnel in southern Yunnan's Mengla County. The signing ceremony was billed as a "clean railway project".

The ceremony was attended by high-ranking officials from China and Laos, according to the China Railway Group, which is the leading company involved in the project.

Li Shulei, deputy secretary of the CPC Central Commission for Discipline and Inspection, said the China-Laos Railway is a landmark in terms of the Belt and Road Initiative. Keeping the railway free from corruption is a shared responsibility for both China and Laos, which will surly benefit the people of both countries.

Soukkhamphet Heuangbouthsy, vice president the Lao People's Revolutionary Party (LPRP) Central Inspection Committee, said that as signature initiative of friendly cooperation between China and Laos, the railway will turn the latter from a "landlocked country" into a "land-linked one". Such an accomplishment will bring great momentum to the deepening of economic and trade ties between China and Laos.

He added that the Lao side will strengthen Party discipline to ensure that the project abides by all related rules and follows a specific code of conduct.

Wang Tongjun, deputy general manager of China Railway Group, said that anti-graft measures should be carried across the entire course of the railway project. That includes joint planning, inspection and evaluation periods, and the implementation of risk prevention and control mechanisms.

The companies said they will draft specific measures to stamp out malpractice in every phase of the project. This covers procurement and construction to operation management. Overseers will enhance the exchange of information and severely punish those found to take or offer bribes.

With a cost of 37.43 billion yuan-- 70 percent of it coming from China and the other 30 percent from Laos -- work on the China-Laos Railway began in December of last year. The 414-kilometre line is designed for trains running at up to 160 kilometres per hour.

Beginning at Kunming's South Railway Station, the line winds southward through Yuxi, Pu'er and Xishuangbanna in China, passing through MuangXay, LuangPrabang and VangViang, and finally arrives in the Lao capital of Vientiane. A total of 32 stations are scheduled to be built along the route.

The China-Laos Railway is the first overseas route connecting the railroad network in China.
