# Xi's diplomacy wins friends FM says

The diplomacy to be rolled out by Chinese President Xi Jinping as head of state this year will "write a brand new chapter" of major-country diplomacy with Chinese characteristics in the new era, Foreign Minister Wang Yi said

Xi will chair four major events to be hosted by China at home this year, Wang noted at a news conference in Beijing on March 8 when asked about the kind of diplomacy conducted by the top Chinese leader.

Diplomacy by heads of state is the highest form of international exchange, and it comes with strategic value that exchanges in other forms cannot replace, Wang said.

This year China will host the Boao Forum for

Asia annual conference, the Shanghai Cooperation Organization summit, the Forum on China-Africa Cooperation Summit and the first China International Import Expo.

Xi will also attend the BRICS Summit in South Africa, the APEC Economic

Leaders' Meeting in Papua New Guinea and the G20 Summit in Argentina this

Xi has visited 57 countries and received more than 110 foreign heads of state since the 18th National Congress of the Communist Party of China in 2012. Such diplomacy has deepened the world's understanding to China, boosted China's profile and influence and laid down a blueprint for the resolution of many global problems, Wang said.

He noted that he and Trump agreed to maintain contact at the highest level as they strategically navigate bilateral ties. The term "head-of-state diplomacy" was mentioned by Xi as he hosted visiting President Donald Trump of the United States in November.

Ruan Zongze, vicepresident of the China Institute of International Studies, said head-of-state diplomacy allows political navigation to take place at a strategic height, and it boosts China's ties with other countries.

From an economic viewpoint, these changes are related to the direction of China's economic development. Internet-based companies and the high-end manufacturing industry have emerged in force because China has promoted supply-side structural reforms in recent years.

## 20-day motor-ride in Laos and Thailand

During the Spring Festival holiday this year, four men from east China's Jiangsu Province traveled on motorcycles. They set off from Changzhou City, rode west into Yunnan and entered Laos and Thailand via the border gate in Xishuangbanna Prefecture.

"Someone suggested traveling to Southeast Asia by motorcycle. We all thought it was a good idea and went for it," said ride-member Jin. At the age of 43, Jin is the oldest and most experienced of the four riders, and he acted as their captain during the journey.

According to Jin, they got their exit permits one day before the New Year and left China for Laos, beginning their exotic ride at 3:30pm. Over the ensuing days, they drove through the Lao cities of Vientiane and Vang Vieng, as well as Bangkok and Pattaya in Thailand.

"Having roamed four days in Laos, we entered Thailand. And we rode in Thailand for another four days and then returned to Laos, where we chose another route for further exploration. That took another four days," said Jin. In total they spent

more than 20 days in the saddle, covering more than 7,000 kilometres.

In Laos and Thailand, the locals were very friendly. They even invited the Chinese motorcyclists to attend a wedding. "We came across two weddings along the way!" Jin said. "The scenery is actually secondary, and I was more interested in the real life of the locals." Jin felt that in the countryside of both Laos and Thailand, people hold honest and optimistic points of view, which touched him.
