China, Laos ink MoU on medicinal cooperation

A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed here on April 17 between China and Laos on medicinal plants research cooperation, the Chinese embassy in Laos

The agreement was signed by Huang Luqi, executive vice president of the China Academy of Chinese Medical Sciences, and Gosorn Sorsulithane, vice president of Traditional Medicine Research Institute under Lao Public Health Ministry, the embassy told Xinhua.

According to the MoU, China and Laos will carry out a medicinal resource census in Laos, in order to fully tap the economic and medicinal values of Laos' special botanical resources. The two sides will also compile "Flora of Laos."

The two sides will jointly set up a traditional medicine research center, which will carry out comparative studies of Chinese and Lao medicinal plants, train Lao medicinal plant resources researchers.

At the signing ceremony, Lao Health Minister Bounkong Sihavong expressed the belief that Laos-China cooperation on traditional medicine will help Laos to uphold its traditional medicine and enhance medical service for Lao people.

Poverty-stricken village finds key to prosperity

Although suitable for planting coffee, Xinzhai Village in western Yunnan was once in deep poverty. Thanks to its advantageous natural conditions and the strong leadership of the local government, the village now finds one key to prosperity is its position as the 'Number 1 Coffee Planting Village' in China.

Located in Yunnan's Baoshan City, Xinzhai Village sits in the Lujiangba Valley near the banks of the Nu River. With copious amounts of

Malaysian Xiatian opens sushi restaurant in Kunming

Huang Xiatian, meaning 'summer', comes from Penang, Malaysia. She used to work for Dell as a whitecollar worker, but she quit that job because of her love to Japanese sushi and the Spring City of Kunming.

On October 1, 2017, hav-

ing learned to prepare sushi, Xiatian started her vegetarian restaurant—Sushi Kitchen on Wenhua Lane in Kun-

Xiatian always uses the word "destiny" to explain why she came to Kunming, the capital city of Yunnan

She used to receive a fat paycheck from Dell and lived a stable life. However, she likes challenges and is "destined" to pursue a more exciting life. There are always some turning points in our lives, and her turning point happened during a meal.

"I always wanted to find a job in another field. I was eating in an outlet of Sushi Kitchen in Penang one day when it occurred to me that I could join the restaurant. Then I quit my job and started as a dishwasher at Sushi Kitchen," Xiatian recalled. Was it a hot-headed decision? No. She started from the low-

est level and worked at the restaurant for two years.

When Sushi Kitchen, a vegetarian restaurant with six outlets in Malaysia, was considering a seventh outlet, Xiatian suddenly had an idea. "Why not China?" she suggested. She next chose to locate the outlet in Kunming, making the decision without hesitation.

"To make sure the food is authentic, we transport a lot of ingredients directly from Malaysia by air," Xiatian said. Some dishes are very special and require more than ten different kinds of natural spices. The business is thriving.

Yunnan speeds up build of aviation network

Yunnan gears up for 5th

China-South Asia Expo

In a bid to accelerate the build-up in aviation infrastructure, the Yunnan Airport Group has planned to invest 3.485 billion yuan in civil aviation construction in 2018.

By the end of February, the group had completed a total of 245 million yuan in physical investment. The construction of key projects such as the renovation and expansion of the second phase of the Tengchong Airport and the Lanping General Airport is being accelerated.

Terminal 2 of the

Tengchong Airport covers an area of 22,000 square meters, designed to fully show the characteristics of Tengchong's geographical location in Southwest Yunnan. The terminal features natural air-conditioning and lighting, making the airport energy-saving.
