Laotian and Bangladeshi seminars held in Kunming

The opening ceremonies for the 2018 Bangladesh Public Management Seminar and the 2018 Laos Primary and Secondary School Teachers Seminar, were recently held in Kunming. The seminars are sponsored by the Chinese Ministry of Commerce and organized by the Yunnan International Economic and Technological Exchange Centre.

A total of 48 officials from Bangladesh and Laos attended. The training programmes invited experts and scholars from the Chinese government, universities and public management and educational professionals to explain the achievements of China's economic development, as well as elucidate the experiences gained in the field of educational public management and research.

This year, 27 foreign aide training programmes will be sponsored by the Chinese Ministry of Commerce, organized by the Yunnan International Economic and Technical Exchange Centre. The programmes are expected to train 631 participants.

The centre has trained 1,129 officials from 67 countries. The trainings covered trade, infrastructure, agriculture, and more.

Nature never fails to amaze us with its fascinating phenomena like sinkholes. And the six spectacular karst sinkholes which are located in Wude Town, northeast Yunnan's Zhenxiong County are a typical case.

The sinkholes, which take up about 600 mu

In northern and central Laos, mountains seem to reign the area where population is scarce. There was almost nothing but primeval forests and traces of traditional cultivation ways left by mountainous residents.

However, since the beginning of construction of China-Laos railway, the area has been witnessing massive changes. The most obvious change brought about by the construction of the China-Laos railway is the new roads running

Prabang area in northern Laos, the 1801 provincial road used to be a narrow, steep and bumpy dirt road curving around slopes. After being included in the construction of China-Laos railway, the China Railway International Group set up a special maintenance team to widen the road and decrease slopes. Now the road is either covered with sand stone, or blacktopped.

The construction section of China Railway No.8 Engineering Group Co., Ltd. (CREC8) is located on Laos' northern Luang Prabang area along the Mekong river, some

around the area, creating a peninsula surrounded by water and mountain. There had been no power supply in the area, thus living and production conditions were quite hard.

Thanks to the Chinese construction team, the area was officially connected to electricity grid in July, 2017. The "No Man's Land" has now entered into the "power era".

China-Laos railway starts from the Mohan-Moten border area between the two countries, running over 400 km to Lao capital Vientiane.

Sun Bird Mother, a Zhuang ethnic musical piece presented by southeast Yunnan's Xichou County, has won the award of Best Original Film Song at the 2018 Universe Multicultural Film Festival (UMFF) in the American city of Los Angeles on April 9.

40 original musical works from 28 countries completed during the 2018 UMFF, and eight pieces from six countries survived the first round of selection by film and art juries. More than 1,000 films from 43 nations were presented to

this year's festival.

The Sun Bird Mother is originally an ancient myth of the Zhuang ethnic group in Xichou, from which local beliefs and rituals are derived. Named after the Zhuang myth, the awarded Yunnan music is made up of seven songs.
