Yunnan pushes ahead poverty relief with Mekong countries

Yunnan is the Chinese province leading the way in pioneering poverty-reduction efforts with the neighbouring Mekong countries. It has done a good job in supplying Myanmar with the technology needed for economic growth. It has also shared its poverty-reduction experiences with other Mekong countries, stated a press release from a Lancang-Mekong Cooperation (LMC) seminar held in Kunming on March 21.

Undertaken by the International Poverty Reduction Centre in Yunnan (IPRCY), "China's technical assistance to Myanmar" initiative is one of the 100 poverty-reduction projects proposed by Chinese President Xi Jinping at the High Level Roundtable on South-South Cooperation. It focuses on the build-up of rural infrastructure, public services, livelihood improvement projects, capacity enhancement, and rural management in accordance with local conditions.

The project has already been officially launched. Yunnan has set up a joint project-management office with Myanmar's related departments

and sent work teams to the country to explain Yunnan's successful poverty-reduction experience and practices. This is done to increase the poverty-reduction capabilities of relevant Myanmar governmental departments.

Yunnan has also given full play to its geographic advantages in terms of international poverty alleviation. The province is cooperating with other

Mekong countries in developing superior industries, breeding new crop varieties, training agricultural technicians and trading agricultural products.

While exporting its new agricultural technology and new crop varieties to the Mekong countries, Yunnan has also invited agricultural professionals from neighbouring countries to attend related training

Through the implementation of a wide range of projects and practical poverty reduction measures based on agricultural cooperation, the border areas along the Mekong River have seen steady economic and social progress. Because of these efforts, social stability is enhanced, cross-border drug trafficking is being eliminated and the incomes of local farmers increased.

In the future, Yunnan will continue its leading role in international cooperation on poverty reduction, while also reinforcing traditional friendships with Mekong countries. This will spur increased economic activity, personnel exchanges, and deepened cooperation in the fight to reduce poverty.

Also, the province will further explore new ideas, new mechanisms and new approaches in poverty reduction. Yunnan will serve as a bridge for poverty alleviation so as to better share with the Mekong countries the achievements of China's economic and social development.

China's poverty reduction is 'On the right path'

This year, at China's 'Two Sessions' (the annual meeting of the National People's Congress and the Chinese Peoples' Political Consultative Conference), poverty alleviation was one of the topics that attracted much attention. 

Sino-Thai railway cooperation project progressing smoothly

Thanin Somboon, Director of the Highways Department of the Ministry of Transport of Thailand, said on March 22 at the construction site of the Sino-Thai Railway Cooperation Project in Pak Chong County, Nakhon Ratchasima, Thai-

land, that the civil works of the first phase of the project are proceeding smoothly and related experience will be applied to the construction of other sections. Thanin said that China is re-

sponsible for design of the highspeed rail project. The Highways Department is mainly responsible for the civil engineering work such as embankments and the follow-up track-laying work will be conducted by the Chinese side. He said that China and Thailand have cooperated smoothly in the construction of the first section and it is expected that the relevant cooperation experience gained from the first stage of construction can be used in the construction of the remaining sections.

A Thai engineer on the site told the reporter that Sino-Thai cooperation in building the high-speed railway is a learning process for Thailand. Some equipment, such as light dynamic penetrators, is imported from China. China undertakes the design, construction supervision, signal systems, electricity, and vehicles for this project and provides training for Thai personnel as well.

The kick-off ceremony for the first phase of the Sino-Thai Railway Cooperation Project, the Bangkok-Nakhonkaul high-speed railway, was held on December 21 last year in Pak Chong, Nakhon Ratchasima. The project has a total length of 253 kilometers, a design speed of 250 kilometers per hour, and 6 stations. Chinese high-speed rail technology will be used for the whole line. It will be the first high-speed railway in Thailand when it is completed.

Laos steps up cooperation with GMS countries for rail connectivity

Laos continues to cooperate with its neighboring countries for sustainable railway connectivity in the Greater Mekong Subregion (GMS) while pursuing its dream to transform the country from landlocked to landlinked, the local daily Vientiane Times reported.

The director general of the Planning and Cooperation Department under the Ministry of Public Works and Transport, Laos, Sengdarith Kattignasack, made the comments during the GMS Association Board of Directors General Meeting in the Lao capital Vientiane.

He added that the Lao government's policy is to transform the country into a transit transport service provider within the feasibility study stage.

First is the under-construction railway from the China-Laos border to Vientiane which is over 400 km long. The railway is now some 30 percent complete and has a construction deadline of December, 2021.

They also represent an innovative way to serve and integrate the Belt and Road Initiative.

Zhang Honglie said that with the deepening of China's reform and opening up, its economic development experience has become the focus of the world's attention. Bangkok Business School provides a systematic Chinese financial and economic education for foreign students from various countries. At the same time, it arranges for students to study for a period of time at the Kunming Campus. Students can gain a deeper understanding of China's economic and social development. People trained in this way not only understand China but also understand the actual situation in their respective countries, and are sought after in the job market. Bangkok Business School also participated in the GMS e-commerce research and social service training program, which was well received by the enterprises.

Completing the operation of the Bangkok Business School and promoting the establishment of

the China-Australia Joint Business School are the main tasks for YUFE in internationalization for this year.

According to previous reportings,in recent years, Yunnan Province, taking advantage of its regional advantages, has accelerated the opening up of its educational institutions to the outside world.
