Operating faced a myriad permits and of requirements for other types of permits. The reform to separate the operating permits and business licenses aims to solve this problem by simplifying the administrative procedures of examination and approval, thus improving the business environment.

The Yunnan Provincial People's Government recently issued the Plan for Pilot Reform of Separating Operating Permits from Business Licenses in the China (Yunnan) Pilot Free Trade Zone (hereinafter referred to as the Plan). According to the Plan, from December 1<sup>st</sup>, the reform has been launched in the Kunming, Honghe and Dehong areas of the China (Yunnan) pilot free trade zone (FTZ) to separate operating permits from business licenses. This involves 331 enterpriserelated business licensing procedures. According to the Plan, the

**Indoor zoos and pet** cafes emerging in Kunming

Pet cafes and indoor zoos are an emerging trend in Kunning. These places attract a large number of people who love animals but cannot afford the time and money to keep their own pets.

The Cowboy Rabbit Pet Club in Kunming keeps more than 30 species of animals including alpacas, ponies, foxes, martens, sugar gliders and raccoons. They mostly live in semi-open captivity. Assisted by the keepers, the

> processes, the procedures will be handled at the time of registration. This means that the different forms of certification required of businesses can be merged into one certificate.

> 53 procedures concern examination and approval carried out by the way of notification and commitment. These include human resources service permits, road freight operation permits and travel agency establishment permits. The authorities concerned shall formulate an accurate and complete list of conditions that are quantifiable, operable and not subjected to

of the regulations, the consequences of violating the commitments, and be provided with a sample letter of notification and commitment.

265 examination and approval services procedures shall be optimised. These include procedures for the pollutant discharge permit, the motor vehicle driver training permit and the advertising release registration. This will result in a reduction of the time needed for examination and approval, improved efficiency and lower costs. (Xinhua)

# **China-Laos railway welding yard** starts operations

The CREC-2 rail-welding base covers an area of about 136 mu (9.07 hectares). Its construction started on May 16<sup>th</sup>, and all the rails for the China-Laos railway will be

welded at the base. The said railway is a strategic project, connecting China's Belt and Road initiative with Laos's "landlocked to land-linked"

strategy. The railway will run a total length of 414 kilometres from the Boten border town in the north to Vientiane in the south. Designed to accommodate trains with a speed of up to 160 kilometres per hour, this electric passenger and freight railway is expected to go into operation in December 2021.

How do the pet bars and indoor zoos ensure hygiene and safety? According to Zhou Mo, owner of the Cowboy Rabbit Pet Club, his shop requires the visitors to clean and disinfect their hands and put on special gloves before entering the animal interaction area. Yuanmou County is mainly inhabited by the Yi ethnic minority. There, the tradition of Yi embroidery has been passed down to today. Yu Jincui began to learn this traditional handicraft from her mother and grandmother when she was eight years old.

Yi Sister Embroidery Association, together with 12 other embroiderers. In the first year she sold 246 pieces of embroidery and earned 60,000 RMB (8,534 U.S. dollar). Other embroiderers also increased their income.

In 2015, with the support of the local government, Yu founded the Yi Sister Embroidery Company Inc. and started to sell
